

If you are considering surrendering your Corgi or other small breed dog, there are a few important things you should know about our surrender process:

First, please make sure that you are surrendering as a last resort or for the safety of your pet. There may be alternative solutions that we are happy to advise upon. We highly recommend that positive reinforcement training and medical and behavioral and veterinary consultation and evaluation take place prior to making this important decision. We can provide recommendations for this depending on your location.

We are a foster-based rescue and do not have a shelter. Therefore, we must have an appropriate foster home available BEFORE we can take your dog into rescue. Finding the appropriate foster home can take time. Please do not expect to surrender your dog the same day you contact us. Contacting us as soon as possible will greatly assist the process.

We also offer the opportunity for owners to foster their dog temporarily while we actively search for a permanent home. To initiate this process, we kindly ask you to coordinate with a CCFR volunteer and bring the dog to the Denver Metro area for evaluation. Additionally, we will ask you to bring all relevant medical records along with the dog.

The initial step in the surrender process is to send an email to corgisandfriends@gmail.com. Please provide us with a detailed explanation of why you need to surrender your dog, including as much information as possible. Additionally, we request that you attach several recent photos of your dog, including full-body images.

To ensure we can find the most suitable foster home for your dog, we require you to complete the Owner Surrender Form. Providing honest and thorough information about your dog is crucial. Failure to disclose any behavioral or health issues will only create challenges for our rescue and potentially impact the overall well-being of the dog. Please note that if your dog has recently bit a person and broke skin, they must legally complete a 10 day quarantine prior to being surrendered or moved to a foster home.

Upon completing and signing the Owner Surrender Form, you acknowledge and consent to transferring legal ownership of your dog to the rescue. Additionally, we kindly request that you provide us with copies of all records pertaining to your dog, including their comprehensive veterinary records.

Your dog will be placed in a foster family's care, where they will have the opportunity to evaluate the dog's personality firsthand. This will enable us to identify the most suitable forever home for them. Please note that all dogs we adopt out must be up to date on their vaccines, heartworm tested and altered. There are no exceptions to this. In addition, we cannot guarantee a bonded pair will remain together. While we will do our best to keep them together if we determine they are indeed bonded, we just cannot guarantee it.

Once we successfully match your dog with a forever home, we ensure the confidentiality of both the surrendering owner and the adopter by not disclosing their contact information to each other. However, if you would like to receive updates on how your dog is doing in their new home, you are more than welcome to reach out to CCFR and we'd be happy to share!
